

CHCSS0081 Induction to Disability Skill Set

Course Overview

This course provides introductory training to develop skills to support people with disability. It provides a set of skills for a variety of roles supporting people with disability including providing individual support, working safely, and communicating effectively to facilitate the empowerment of people with a disability.

Target Audience

This course is suited to school leavers and young people seeking an introduction to the disability sector.

Benefits

• Opportunities to learn about the disability care sector and an introduction to the community services sector. • Access to experienced trainers and community sector experts

Learning Outcomes

In this course you will learn how to:

- Develop communication skills to effectively deal with clients and collaborate with colleagues
- Complete required reporting
- Support individuals to facilitate choice and self-determination, while fostering human rights
- Determine support needs and provide support services to individuals
- Apply safe working practices when providing support, including safe manual handling and infection control.

Career Opportunities

Students completing this course could apply for entry level care roles in the disability or community services sector. These units also provide credit towards a range of qualifications in the CHC Community Services Training Package, including the CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support.



Course Duration

This skill set is a four (4) week course, run from 9:00am to 3.30pm two (2) days per week. In addition, students will be required to complete eight hours per week self-paced work.

Entry Requirements

Students will need to undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy quiz prior to enrolment. This quiz will help us to determine the appropriate level of academic support that will be needed to support you to successfully complete your training and assessment.

To access any available funding, you must be:

- At least 15 years of age
- no longer at school;
- Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, Australian humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen;
- living or working in NSW.

Assessment

You will be assessed using a combination of theory and practical assessments. These assessments will be completed in class time.

On successful completion of your training and assessment you will be eligible to receive CHCSS00081 Introduction to Disability Skill Set.
