

CHC33021 Certificate III In Individual Support (Ageing Or Disability)

Course Overview

This qualification reflects the role of workers in the community and/or residential setting who follow an individualised plan to provide person-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing, disability, or some other reason. Work involves using discretion and judgement in relation to individual support as well as taking responsibility for own outputs. Workers have a range of factual, technical, and procedural knowledge, as well as some theoretical knowledge of the concepts and practices required to provide person-centred support.

Target Audience

People who would like to pursue a career in the individual support, disability or aged care sectors. Ideally potential students will have access to a community sector workplace, completing at least one shift per week.

Benefits

- Enhanced career opportunities for entry level roles as community care and personal care workers, particularly for older clients and those with a disability
- Access to experienced trainers and community sector experts

Learning Outcomes

This qualification is comprised of nine (9) core units of competency and six (6) elective units of competency. The core units are:

Course Duration

This course will be delivered over 12 months (49 weeks) and includes a minimum of 16 hours per week face to face training and up to 8 hours independent study. Students will also be required to complete a work placement of a minimum of 120 hours.

Entry Requirements

Students must:

- Be at least 18 years of age and have completed the equivalent of Year 12.
- Participate in a course entry interview to determine suitability for the course and student needs.
- Have language, literacy, and numeracy (LLN) skill sufficient to complete the course, for example, to read
 materials relevant to the course, participate in discussions and roleplays and apply numerical concepts such as
 time management. Students will need reading skills to be able to read and interpret policies, procedures, and
 client documents. Students will need to undertake a short Language Literacy and Numeracy quiz prior to
 enrolment. This quiz will help us to determine the appropriate level of academic support that will be needed to
 support you to successfully complete your training and assessment.
- Be prepared to obtain necessary workplaces clearances including Police Checks, Working with Children Checks and vaccinations certificates.

To access funding, students must be:

- no longer at school;
- an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, Australian humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen;
- living or working in NSW.

Assessment

The assessment methods used for this course are a combination of questions, demonstrations, portfolios, projects, third party evidence and will include a workplace component of 120 hours.

Accreditation & Award

On successful completion of all the fifteen (15) units, and fulfilling the requirements of work placement, students will be awarded with the qualification CHC33021 Cert III in Individual Support.
